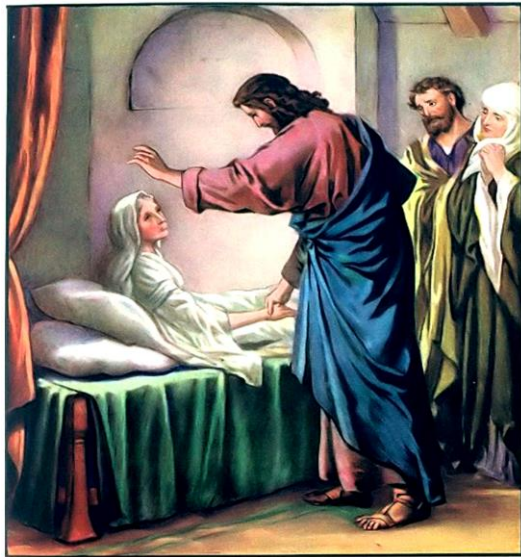

**St. Joseph School Enrollment for 2021-2022**

**Enrollment is now open to everyone beginning February 1<sup>st</sup>.** Again, we fully expect, especially in the lower grades, to have full classes to our limit of 24 per class. Several grades are near capacity now. (Kindergarten and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade are already full).

The High School Preparatory Program, grades 5, 6, 7, and 8 have multiple openings. At the end of Catholic Schools Week we have 202 students enrolled in pre-school and grade school for next fall. The High School Preparatory Program especially invites your look.

Currently, from our graduating class this year, 2 have chosen St. Thomas, 2 have chosen Hoban, and 4 have chosen St. Vincent/St. Mary. All of these have won scholarship money after taking competitive tests.
